Course Description for P-Spanish II (FLA201, FLA202)

DEPARTMENT: World Language

GRADE: Open to all grades

LENGTH: 1 year

CREDITS: 10 (Ten)

PREREQUISITE: Spanish I or equivalent proficiency

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Students who received a "D" grade in Spanish are cautioned that Spanish II

will be extremely difficult for them. This course consists of review of Spanish I on a more advanced level and a deeper exploration into the

language.

EXIT CRITERIA: By the end of the school year, students are expected to do the following:

Listening

- 1. Can comprehend short conversations on sample topics in everyday situations.
- 2. Because of limited vocabulary range, repetition or circumlocution may be necessary.
- 3. Can understand frequently used tense forms and word patterns in simple sentences.
- 4. Has both general and detailed understanding of short, discreet expressions.
- 5. Has only general understanding of longer conversations and messages within familiar communicative situations.
- 6. Can sustain comprehension through textual inferences in short communication and familiar topics with native speakers who are aware of the non-native status of the listener.

Speaking

- 1. Can initiate and sustain a conversation, but limited vocabulary range necessitates hesitation and circumlocution.
- 2. Can use the more common verb tense forms but still makes many errors in formation and selection.
- 3. Can use word order accurately in simple sentences, but still makes errors in more complex patterns.
- 4. Can sustain coherent structures in short and familiar communicative situations.
- 5. Can employ selectively basic cohesive features such as pronoun and verb inflections.
- 6. Can communicate largely in a series of short, discreet expressions.

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- 7. Can speak with some effort and has to repeat words in order to be understood by the general public.
- 8. Can articulate comprehensively but has difficulty in producing certain sounds in certain positions or in certain combinations.

Reading

- 1. Can understand a simple narrative and descriptive authentic materials and edited texts within a familiar topic.
- 2. Has specific comprehension of selected passages in familiar sentence patterns?
- 3. Can follow essential points as well as some details of expository writing when dealing with areas of specific interest.
- 4. Can guess meaning from context.

Writing

- 1. Can write simple notes, letters and short reports using elementary vocabulary and commonly encountered structures.
- 2. Can express present and future ideas accurately and past ideas comprehensively.
- 3. Can express more complex thoughts although major errors occur.
- 4. Begins to develop sequential relationships.
- 5. Can write comprehensively so that native speakers used to dealing with foreigners understand.

Cultural Understanding

- 1. Can show understanding of cultures as systems of values that evolve with time.
- 2. Can show how certain values are associated with certain behavior patterns in his/her own culture as well as the target language culture.
- 3. Can distinguish some culturally authentic patterns of behavior from idiosyncratic behaviors on the basis of previous experience with the target language culture.
- 4. Can acquire some new cultural patterns through observation of authentic models.
- 5. Still show misunderstandings and miscommunications when interacting with native speakers not accustomed to dealing with foreigners.
