COURSE DESCRIPTION: Skills of listening, speaking, reading, writing, and cultural understanding

Listening Skills

- 1. Can understand main ideas of all speech in a standard dialect, including technical discussions in a field of specialization.
- 2. Can understand idioms, colloquialisms and register shifts.
- 3. Can understand all forms and styles of speech tailored to different audiences.

Speaking Skills

- 1. Can participate effectively in most formal and informal exchanges on practical, social, professional and abstract topics.
- 2. Can support opinions and hypothesize using native-like discourse strategies.
- 3. Can participate in, and contribute to, a discussion based on readings in the target language.

Reading Skills

- 1. Can read, at a normal speed, expository prose on unfamiliar subjects including a variety of literary texts.
- 2. Can read texts independent of subject matter.
- 3. Can read fluently and accurately, most styles and forms pertinent to academic and professional needs.
- 4. Can relate inferences to real world knowledge.
- 5. Can understand almost all sociolinguistic cultural references and any subject matter directed to a general reader.
- 6. Can follow the author's intent in sophisticated editorials, specialized journal articles, literary texts, such as novels, plays and poetry.
- 7. Can follow the author's intents when reading novels, plays and poetry, assigned as outside reading, when aided by a pre-pre-pre-prepared study guide.

Writing Skills

- 1. Can express self effectively in most formal and informal writing on practical, social, and professional topics.
