Recommended Action	That the Board adopt Resolution No. 21-61 authorizing the spending determination of monies received from the Education Protection Act (2021-22).

### Public Content

At the General Election of November 6, 2012 the voters approved Proposition 30, amending the California Constitution by adding Section 36 to Article XIII. Prop 30 did not allocate more money to schools, but instead prevented cuts to LCFF/Prop 98 and created a third funding source for LCFF, namely stated, property taxes and EPA. Pursuant to Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution, monies raised for schools must be deposited in a special account, Education Protection Act. The funds are budgeted as part of the District's adopted budget. School districts, county offices of education, and community college districts are required to determine how the monies received from the Education Protection Act are spent within the jurisdiction, provided the governing board makes the spending determinations in the open session of a public meeting. The language in the constitutional amendment states, "funds shall not be used for the salaries and benefits of the administrators or any other administrative costs."
